- Almost 9 out of 10 U.S. adults has a mobile phone — and 77 percent of those phones are smartphones.
- Nearly 75% of 25- to 34-year-olds live in wireless-only households, versus about 24 percent of people 65 and older.
- About 71% of adults who rent live in wireless-only households.
 Meanwhile, only 43 percent of adults living in owner occupied homes are wireless-only.
- Only 37.4% of adults in the Northeast are wireless-only. In the South, it's 57.1 percent; in the West, 55.5 percent; and in the Midwest, 52.5 percent.



Wireless Nation

More than half of American homes do not have a landline but have at least one wireless phone

By 2020:


- Ubiquitous: the average person will have more conversations with bots than with their partner
- **Growing dominance:** 50% of all searches will be voice searches.
- **Screenless:** 30% of all searches
- Smart speakers are common: By 2022, 55% of all households own one
- Fast growth: 35.6 million Americans used a voice-activated assistant device at least once a month in 2017 — a yearover-year increase of 128.9 percent.



Consumers expect a voice

40% of people who own a voice-activated speaker say it feels like talking to a friend or another person

Tuesday approved a binding referendum to add 0.25 mills to

levy could bring more than \$3 million a year to the library
system for operations and maintenance.




CLP 2016 Innovation Grants: Delight Edition


